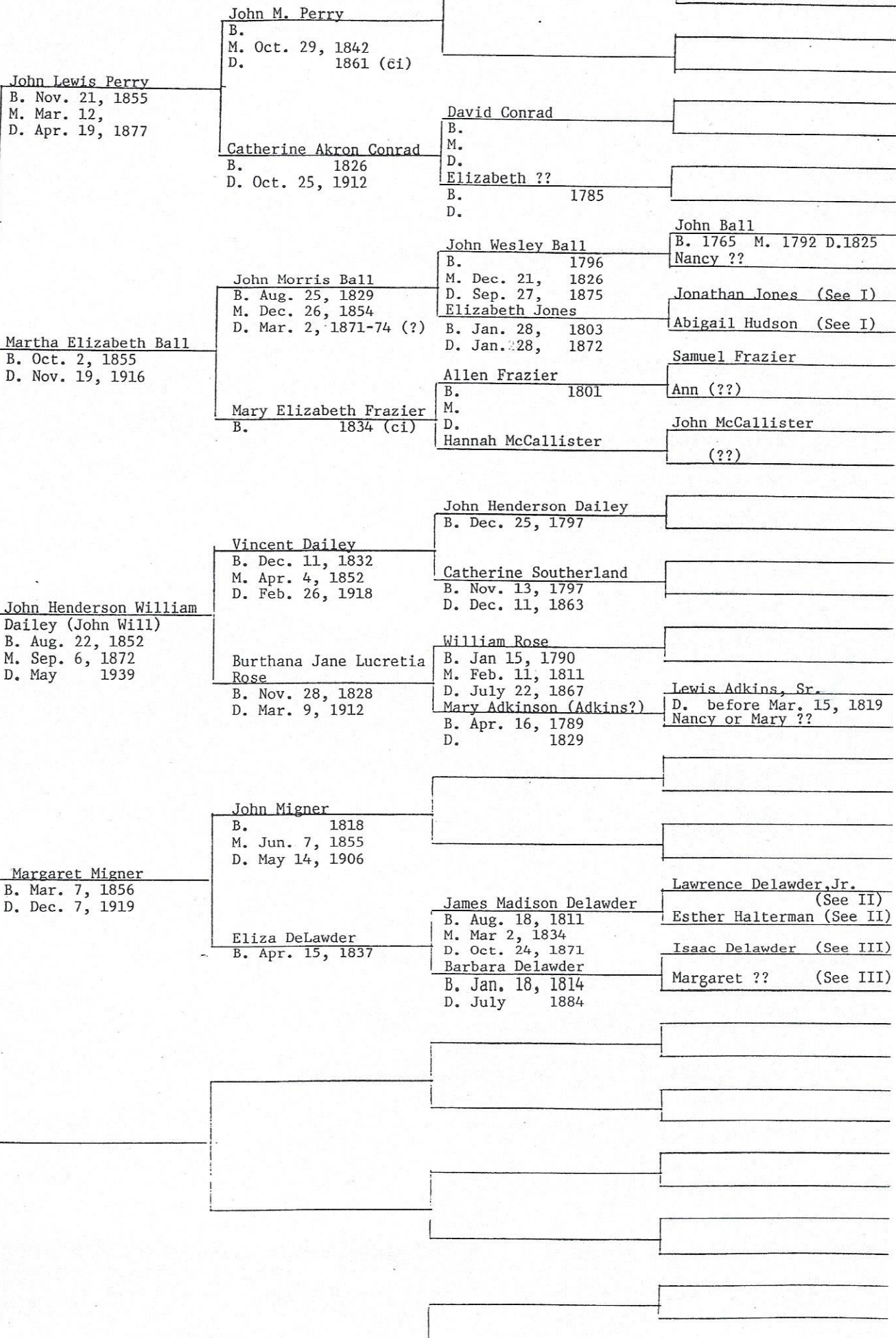

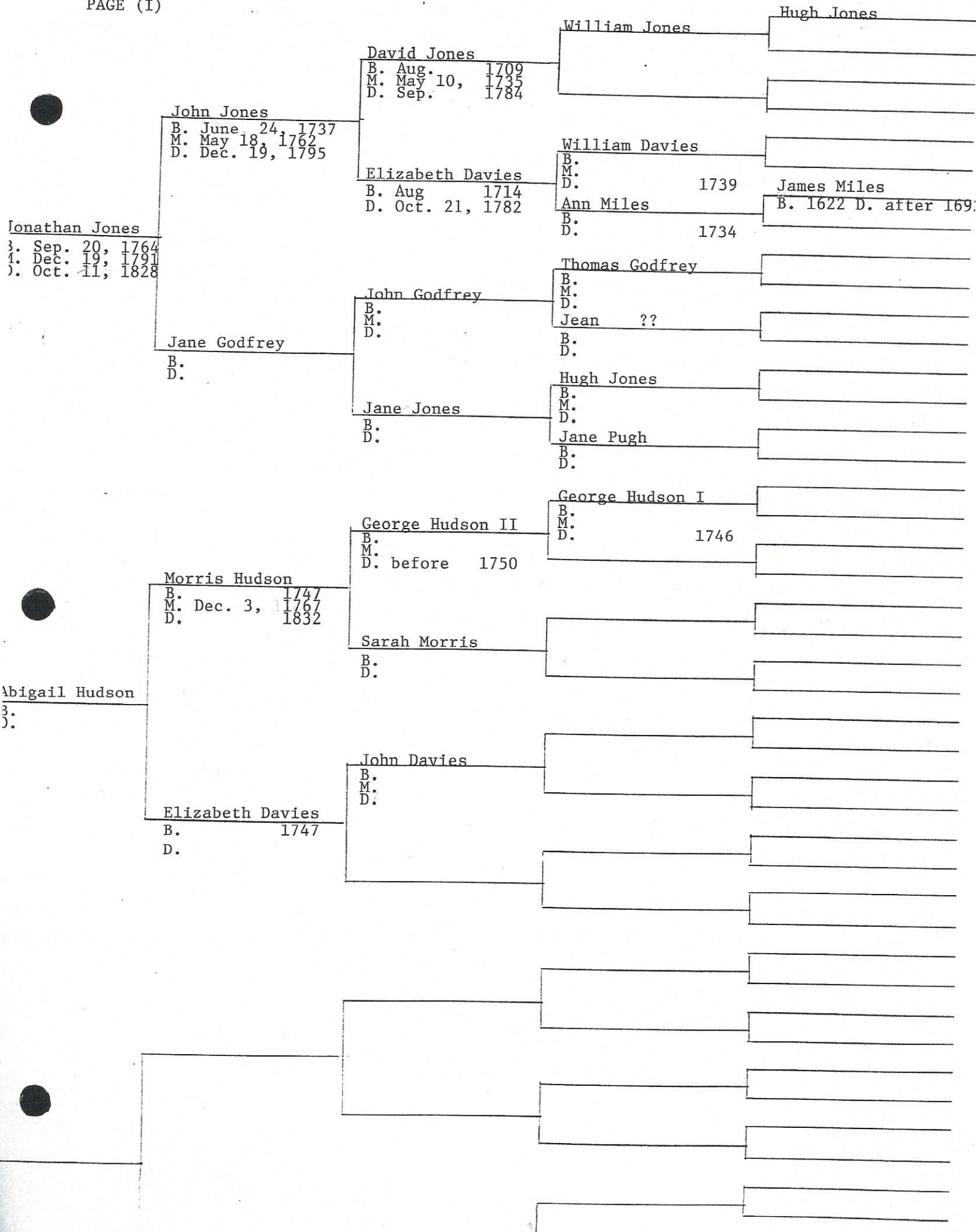

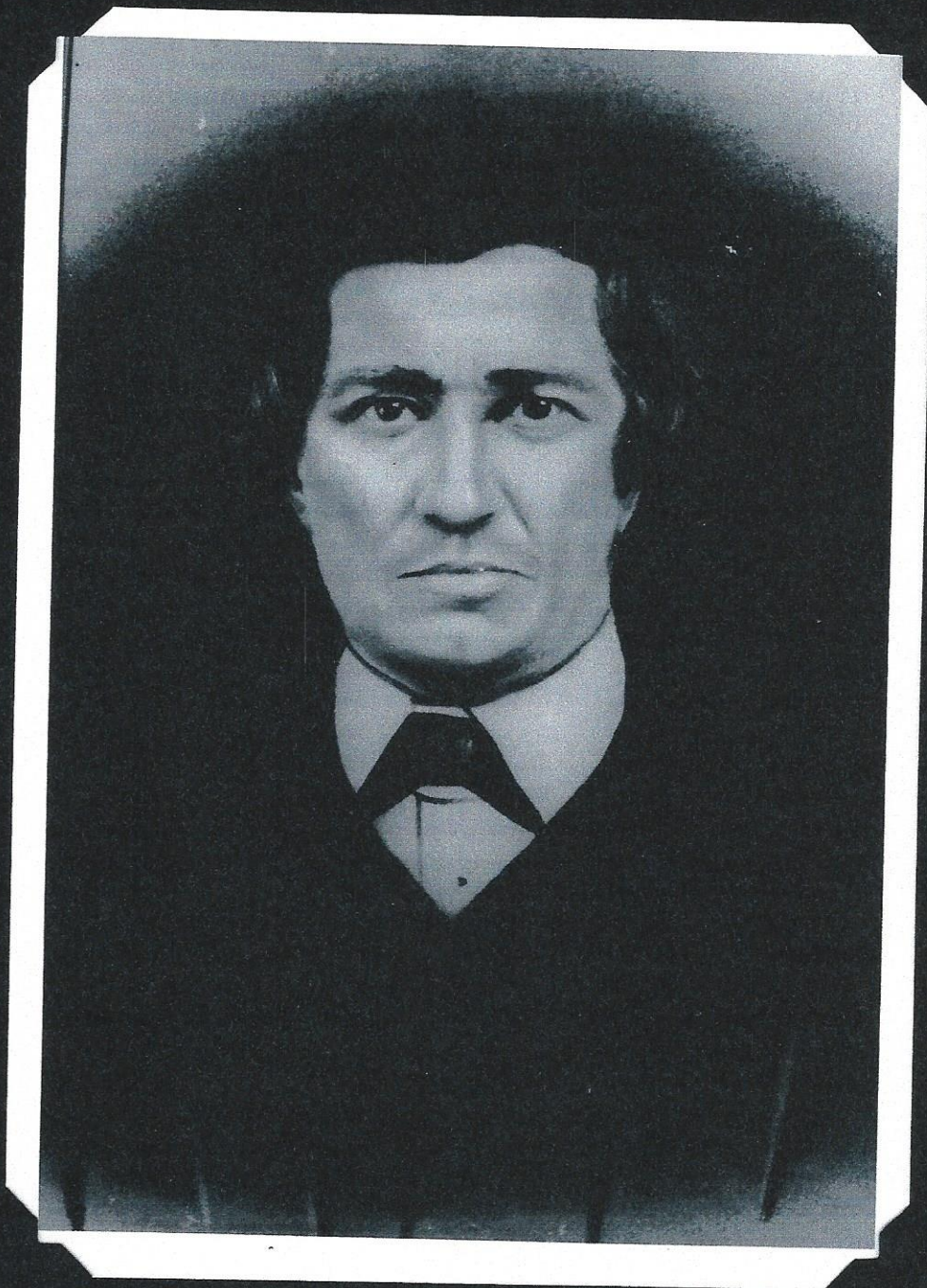

JOHN MIGNOR

The Certificate of Discharge issued by the Army of the United States on 12 March 1863, said that John Mignor (Private John Mangani) age 31, was born in Genoa, Kingdom of Italy. He is five feet five and one-half inches in height has a light complexion, hazel eyes and dark hair. He is listed as a farmer by occupation. The age given in the discharge sets his birthdate in 1832. However, in later documents, he is said to be 69 in January of 1885 which would set his birthdate in 1816. Again in July of 1890 his age is given as 73 which would put his birthdate in 1817. If either of the latter two dates are correct, his age when he enlisted would have been 46 or 45, respectively. Those dates would have made him 14 or 15 years older than he is said to be in the discharge paper. It seems more likely that his birthdate was in 1832 because if he had been born in 1816, the date of his death in 1906 would have placed his age at 90 years, which seems highly unlikely, considering his health history.

He had been married on 14 April 1855 in Lawrence County, Ohio to Eliza Delawder the daughter of James Madison Delawder and Barbara Delawder, James' first cousin. Some of the information shows that their first child was not born until after the war, in 1867, and that there were a total of 10 children in their family. The names of the 10 children are Alfred, John, Henderson, James, Cyrus, Alice, Mary, Margaret, Barbara and Nancy. Their first child was not born until some four years after he was discharged from the army. Of the 10 children, Margaret married John William Dailey, and Alice married Harley Null.

Later in life (15 January 1898) in a questionnaire sent by the Bureau of Pensions, John was asked if he had any living children and if so what were their names and birth dates. He replied "ten children cannot remember their names and dates of birth youngest about 23 years old". In that same questionnaire he said that he had been married in Ohio in 1861 (he was actually married in 1855), but was no longer married, and he said he was a "widower wife divorced".

John enrolled in the Army of the United States as a private in Company H of the Ninth West Virginia Volunteers headed by Captain Joseph Wheeler on 8 April 1862, 7 years after the marriage. He enrolled in the service in Oakridge, Ohio for 3 years, but was discharged in March of 1863 because

of illness. He was discharged "because he has not been able to perform his duties during the last two months" due to condition described as "Tabes Disenterica - swelled belly, weakness and usual signs". Literally translated this condition is a wasting due to a chronic intestinal disease. At the time he was discharged, he was stationed at the general hospital in Gallipolis, Ohio.

Having been discharged from the army for medical reasons did not mean he would receive compensation. On 13 October 1883 (some 20 years after his discharge) he was denied a pension by the war Department because "no evidence of disabilities alleged nature of sickness not stated Required Hospital Records or Co morning reports are not filed". John Mignor had to sue the United States government for compensation, such as it was. Again in 1885 his lawyer put in a claim for disability compensation. John's affidavit dated 7 April 1885 said: "I enlisted in the year 1861 in Co. H. 9 Reg. W. Va. Vn. and in August I was taken sick with typhoid fever brought on by exposure to bad weather I was also affected with chronic diarrhea and general debility. Was at Galley (actually Gauley) Bridge W. Va. when taken sick was sent to Galley Bridge Camp hospital from there to Charleston to Gallipolis Ohio and remained there 5 months Then discharged from the service I have been suffering from said disability from said time up to the present date I am not able to do more then 1/3 the work I could do before my enlistment".

After about 6 years, he finally got compensation from the federal government on 14 July 1890. His compensation was \$12 per month. John Mignor died in the National Military Home in Dayton, Ohio on 14 May 1906 and was laid to rest in the military graveyard adjacent to the facility.

His former wife, Eliza (Delawder) Mignor, having since taken up with Robert Aldridge, a former member of Co. G, Fourth Ohio Cavalry, attempted to receive a widow's pension based on her marriage to John. However, the pension was denied; "Rejection on the ground no title as (common?) law marriage with Robert Aldridge arose at date of soldiers death and there is no period over which to pension claimant as his widow subsequent to the date of filing claim January 7, 1910".

Eliza had two children by Robert Aldridge, Joseph and Grace. Grace married Robert Miller in 1906 and she died on

10 September 1966.

Several stories have been told about how John got to the United States from Italy. One of these is that he stowed away on a vessel bound for the states and that he hid in an empty hogshead and jumped ship when he got to the U.S. Another has it that he landed in Canada first and then came to the U.S. He did come from Italy, but from what part of Italy? The most convincing evidence pointing to his point of origin are his army discharge which states that he came from Genoa, Kingdom of Italy. The spelling of his name poses another question. He was illiterate. Therefore, he could not write his name. However, he could voice his name, which when interpreted by the people who wrote the records, came out spelled in a number of different ways. One person who had heard him say his name was Harley Null. He said that John pronounced it "Mahn-gan-o" which translates to Mangano, a common Italian name. Some of the army records came closest to this pronunciation, notably the discharge paper (Migani), and the War Department's document denying his pension (Migano). Be that as it may, his name has been spelled in many different ways. In the documents researched, John's last name was spelled: Mignor, Magnia, Migano, Migani, Migner, Migans, Magina, Migna, Megna, etc. It probably made no difference to John because the written word had no meaning for him.
