J. WILLIAM FRAZIER FAMILY

Samuel, William and Allen Frazer Frazier came from the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia and settled along the waters of Little Hurricane Creek, in the Teays Valley of Western Virginia about 1830. The Brothers extended their land holdings along the rich river bot toms of the Great Kanawha River and the area where they settled was named Fraziers Bottom. They were among the earliest settlers into the area.

Allen Frazier married Hannah McCallister, daughter of John McCallister and their children were: Allen Thomas, Christopher Columbus, John William, Hannah Elizabeth, Mary (Ball), Margaret Ann (Jones), and Rhoda Jane (McCallister).

Christopher Columbus Frazer (1831-1882) married Abigal Ball (1835-1912), daughter of John Wesley and Elizabeth Jones Ball and they had seven sons: Charles Allen (1855-1920), Morris Wesley (1857-1870), John Robert (1860-1928), Ira Edward (1863-1924), James Monroe (1866-1929), Albert Gallatin (1869-1897), and William Lee (1873-1940).

Charles Allen Frazer married Eliza Ann Errett, daughter of John and Mary Love Errett of Gallia County, in 1887. They were the parents of 12 children: Essie Lee (1888-1899), Stella Mae (Bane) (1889-1972), Farl Herbert (1891-1962), Arnel Ernest (Arme) (1892-1971), Charles Christopher (1894-1918), John William (Bill) (1895-1977), Albert Gallia (Jack) (1897-1934), Fleeda Alexander (North) (1899-1977), Paul (1907-1979), Millard (1905-1907), Kenneth (1907-1974), and Veda (Schaffer) (1909-1977). They were reared at the home place at Fraziers Bottom, Putnam County, West Virginia.

After the death of his father in 1920, Bill moved his ailing Mother and brother Kenneth and sister Veda to Gallipolis by Packet boat and they lived on Vine Street. Bill's Mother died in 1926, about the time of his marriage to Madge Irene Roush, daughter of Maurice Selmer and Melissa Gordon Roush (See Roush Books).

Bill and I bought property on Neil Avenue a couple of years after we were married and we raised our family of four sons: William Joseph (1927-1975), Ralph Selmer (1928), John Robert (1931) and Dean Richard (1934). Raising our family during the depression years was hard but Bill worked at the O.H.E. and raised a large garden in the sum-

mer, so we managed. The boys had paper routes, caddied at the golf course and worked at the bowling alley for their spending money. We didn't travel much except to visit my parents, who lived in the Eno Community and each year we attended the Frazier Reunion at the Fraziers Bottom Methodist Church, I veryone brought a basket lunch and relatives came from far and near.

Our sons attended the local schools and each served in the armed forces: Joe (USA Tank Corp), Ralph (USA 82nd Airborne Division), Robert (USA) and Dean (USAF).

During those years, I worked as a clerk for Orin Thomas in his Dry Goods Store and later in his Wallpaper and Paint Store. After Mr. Thomas retired, I went to work at the G.S.I. and retired from there in 1968. Bill retired in 1960 from the G.S.I., after 35 years of employment.



The following article, written by Vincent Dailey, appears in the book, <u>HISTORY OF GALLIA</u> <u>COUNTY</u>, H. H. Hardesty Co., publishers, 1882, page 19

REV. VINCENT DAILY-was born in the county of Monroe, Ohio, December 11, 1832. He has been acquainted with this neighborhood since his boyhood, when, with the exception of the farm of John Champan, there were no improved farms in this section. All the farms have been improved since 1849. The parents of Mr. Daily are John H. and Catherine (Sutherland) Daily. His father was born in West Virginia, December 25, 1797; his mother was born November 13, 1797, and died December 11, 1863. His father resides in Lincoln county, West Virginia, but at the time of her death he resided in Lawrence county, Ohio. Mr. Daily was married in Lawrence county, Ohio, April 4, 1852, to Burthana J. Rose, who is a native of this county, born November 28, 1828. She is mother of the following children: John H. W., born August 22, 18, resides in this county; James L., May 26, 1854, resides in this county; David S., December 31. 1855, resides in this county; Margaret A., December 16, 1857, died April 19, 1876; Vincent F., who resides at home; Windfield C., and Mary L., (who both died in infancy), January 31, 1860; Jasper F., April 22, 1862, resides at home; Sarah J., November 11, 1867, resides at home; Rosen C., March 8, 1869, died June 23, 1871. The parents of Mrs. Daily were William and Mary (Adkins) Rose, settlers of this county in 1813; her father died July 22, 1867, and her mother in 1829. Mr. Daily was a soldier in the late war, serving two years and nine months in the 91st Ohio Volunteer Infantry; was first corporal, enlisting August 6, 1862, discharged April 28, 1865. He participated in several battles and skirmishes. He was prostrated by a sunstroke in Morgan's raid, which caused palpitation of the heart and bronchitis of the throat. Mr. Daily has had relatives in every war of America. Mr. Daily belongs to the Mount Pleasant Association. He is a resident of the township of Guyan, where he is engaged in preaching and farming. He settled in this county in 1875. He has relatives in nearly every State in the Union. His postoffice address is Crown City, Gallia county, Ohio.
